**Minutes of the Reconvened Annual General Body Meeting
of the Institute of Architects, Pakistan, held on

1. COMMENCEMENT OF MEETING

President IAP Ar. Shahab Ghani Khan requested Ar. Mansoor Ahmed Khan to invoke the meeting.

The President welcomed the members and explained that the AGM scheduled for September 17 had to be reconvened two months later because of lack of quorum due to law & order situation in the city on the day of the meeting. He asked the Honorary Secretary, Ar. Ashraf Shanjer, to start the proceedings according to agenda.

2. CONFIRMATION OF THE MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL GENERAL BODY MEETING HELD ON THURSDAY September 29, 2009 AT IAP HOUSE, KARACHI

Honorary secretary mentioned that the first item of the agenda was the confirmation of minutes of the last AGM and invited for comments/corrections.

(Time was given for the review of the minutes).

Ar. Maria Aslam sought clarification as the agenda required confirmation of minutes of September 29, 2009, whereas the report mentioned confirmation of the minutes of the annual general meeting held at Thursday August 30, 2008.

Honorary Secretary explained that the previous year's minutes contained confirmation of minutes of meeting of the prior year (i.e. 2008) whereas the present agenda required confirmation of the minutes of previous year i.e. 2009.

The President explained that the 2009 AGM confirmed the minutes of the previous year.

There were no further comments and the minutes were approved without any changes. Ar. Fariha Amjad Obaid proposed and Ar. Sohail Abbasi seconded.

3. HONORARY SECRETARY'S REPORT

Honorary Secretary reported the admission of 32 new Associates and 129 Affiliates during the period between July 2009 and June 2010.

Honorary Secretary reported chapter activities during year 2009-10. The activities of the three chapters i.e. Karachi Lahore and Islamabad all comprised Lecture Series, IAPEX and reference for distinguished members who passed away during the year; Architect Arshad Abdullah & Architect Azad Thariani. Lahore held a Grand Convention as well and Karachi Chapter made significant progress regarding construction of IAP House.

Honorary Secretary also reported the extraordinary circumstances which prevailed in Peshawar and resultant lack of activity there. He mentioned the initiative taken by the National Council to revive the Chapter and display of solidarity with the members there.

Honorary Secretary mentioned the special efforts of the Lahore Chapter in general and Ar. Kalim Ahmed Siddiqui, the Convener ACA 14, in particular, for the hard work which went into making the ACA 14 such a huge success.

Report mentioned that after years of effort, IAP Website was now active. Among other achievements of note, were the full and up to date compliance with SECP Regulations and the formal constitution of the Board of Architectural Education.

Efforts regarding the rehabilitation of flood victims were also mentioned. These included 230 structures erected at the relief camp set up by IAP in Makli, near Thatta. The camp has provision for potable water and toilets, a school and dispensary. Report mentioned that a strategy paper for the rehabilitation of the flood affected people was prepared by IAP for the Government and was submitted to the concerned government authorities. A summary of this has already been sent to the Prime Minister and discussed with the Governor Sindh.

In his closing remarks, the Honorary Secretary appreciated the overall dynamism and initiative of the Institute and mentioned areas where improvements are required like the electoral reforms.

After the presentation of Report, President IAP invited observations and comments from members.

Ar Noshed Shah emphasized the need for research regarding the materials being suggested for the flood victims. President IAP endorsed his views and mentioned that IAP was working along the same lines.

Ar. Zareen Fawad Hussain enquired about the criteria for election of Fellows as one of the Chapter's activity mentioned honoring a member who received Fellowship the previous year.

Honorary Secretary explained that the Fellowship was awarded during the term of the previous Council and acknowledged that there were issues which needed to be resolved with regard to the criteria of Fellowship. This item can be taken up later and not during the discussion on the report.

Ar. Zareen Fawad insisted to know the criteria.

IAP President explained that the criteria for conferring Fellowship is that a Fellow could propose another member who has at least 20 years standing in the IAP and has done some commendable work for the profession or education and for the Institute.

On a query from Ar. Zareen Fawad about how to judge that, IAP President responded that this was for the proposer to give a citation and then the National Council deliberates and approves with consensus.

Ar. Sadia Fazli suggested that the criteria be uploaded on the website so that everyone was informed about it. The President agreed with the idea and emphasized the need for required amendments in the Articles. Ar. Sadia Fazli insisted to know how a member from Islamabad was elected a Fellow to the President responded that he could not comment because he was not in the Council when this happened.

Ar. Sadia Fazli however emphasized the need for transparency. The President agreed and closed this discussion by reiterating that this will be addressed when amendments are made in the Articles.

4. PRESENTATION OF ANNUAL BUDGET 2010-11

IAP President explained that this year's budget had been prepared to reduce National Council's share from the respective Chapters because eventually whatever expenditure the National Council does, comes from the Chapters so that it has been rationalized as much as possible. Major expense remained the membership fees paid to international bodies. The other was expense on the Council meetings, which were limited to 4 or 5 in a year. Last year there were more, because of the 14th Asian Congress of Architects in Lahore.

In the absence of Honorary Treasurer Ar. Samar Ali Khan, Honorary Secretary presented the budget.

Honorary Secretary highlighted figures in the last year budget and actual expense and explained that based on these figures projections have been made for expense for the next year. Effort has been made to be as prudent as possible for each head of account.

Allocations for events, AGM and gifts and awards are there but have not been added to the total because they would be financed through separate sponsorships.

Budget for year 2010-2011 was approved without further discussion. Ar. Sadia Fazli proposed and Ar. Kalim Siddiqui seconded.

5. HONORARY TREASURER'S REPORT

In the absence of Honorary Treasurer President IAP presented the report.

He mentioned that this time all the Chapter accounts are consolidated. The audit reports of all the Chapters are there in a consolidated format.

The Honorary Treasurer's Report and the consolidated accounts for the year 2009-10 were approved without any objection.

6. APPOINTMENT OF AUDITORS 2010-2011

President IAP informed that the same auditor who audited accounts last year M/s Baker & Tilly Mehmood Idris offered the services at the same remuneration for all the chapters and consolidated audit. If there was no objection, he proposed they be appointed again.

The appointment of auditors was thereby confirmed. Ar. Anjum Adil proposed and Ar. Farhatullah Qureshi seconded.

7. HOLDING OF ELECTIONS

For the next item holding of election 2010, President IAP requested Ar. Zaigham Jaffrey, a senior IAP member and Fellow to conduct the elections and Ar. Najeeb Omer and Ar. Naji Akber to assist him.

5.0 31ST ARCASIA COUNCIL MEETING & 14TH ASIAN CONGRESS OF ARCHITECTS (ACA-14)

The Institute of Architects, Pakistan, hosted the 31st ARCASIA Council Meeting and the 14th Asian Congress of Architects at Lahore after a gap of 18 years. The event was organized on behalf of IAP by the Lahore Chapter from October 25-30, 2010. A brief summary of the events is given under the Lahore Chapter Activity Report (see Section 7.2)

6.0 IAP NATIONAL COUNCIL ACTIVITIES AND PROGRAMMES 2010-11

6.1 IAP GRADUATE AWARDS 2010-11

IAP in its endeavors to raise the standards of architectural studies at graduate level in Pakistan has instituted the IAP GRADUATE AWARD in order to encourage and recognize exemplary thesis work done by graduating students from Architecture Schools that are accredited by PCATP and recognized by the Board of Architectural Education, IAP.

An independent Panel of Jury Members consisting of leading Architects of Pakistan, nominated by the IAP National Council, assesses and determines the Graduate Award Winner and the National Council announces these AWARDS.

6.2 MEHDI ALI MIRZA AWARDS (MAMA) 2010-11

Mehdi Ali Mirza Awards (MAMA) were instituted almost three decades ago in the memory of IAP Founding Member and first president, Ar. Mehdi Ali Mirza, for recognizing excellence in architectural studies, honoring those graduating students who secure top positions in their respective schools.

6.3 The IAP-KBA AWARD

This is a new Award that will be given each year to a graduating student from any of the accredited Schools of Architecture in Pakistan, whose Thesis Project on “socially responsible architecture” is recognized as outstanding by a jury consisting of three nominees of President IAP and two nominees of KBA Care, an organization formed by friends and students of (late) Prof. Kausar Bashir Ahmad to propagate the legacy of the great teacher. This Award was initiated and will be funded by Ar. Murad Jamil, a founder of KBA Care.

6.4 IAP DESIGN EXCELLENCE AWARDS

These are Awards given every two years under different categories to outstanding architectural projects in the country. The awards are decided by a jury of eminent architects and citizens, headed by the President, IAP. The Convenor of the IAP Design Excellence Awards 2011 cycle, is Ar. Ashraf Shanjer. The Award process will shortly commence and the award ceremony is expected to be held early next year.

6.5 SECURITIES & EXCHANGE COMMISSION OF PAKISTAN (SECP) COMPLIANCE

Members will be happy to know that for the first time, IAP has been fully compliant with the statutory requirements of SECP since last year and all the legal hurdles that have come up subsequently, have been cleared. This status is being maintained by filing all the statutory documents to SECP in time.

6.6 IAP MEMORANDUM & ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION

The exercise in revising the IAP Articles of Association commenced in early 2010 with the intent, firstly, of removing any disparity or conflict between provisions of the Charter of Chapters and the Articles of Association, and secondly, to bring the Articles in line with the requirements of SECP. Two revisions have already been made and the drafts circulated to members of the National Council. The final draft is under preparation and once approved by the National Council, it will be circulated to all the members prior to getting it approved but the General Body of IAP.

6.7 BOARD OF ARCHITECTURAL EDUCATION (BAE)

The Board of Architectural Education, established formally in 2010, has until now acted as a post box, disseminating amongst all the accredited institutions, international news, announcements, students' design competition documents and other relevant news and information. The highly successful organization of the ARCASIA Students' Jamboree at Lahore in October 2010 was due to the participation and efforts of members of BAE who are heads of departments of all the accredited architecture schools. It is however unfortunate that BAE has been unable to act more proactively in educational and student affairs, mainly due to poor response from BAE members.

6.8 INTERNATIONAL ACTIVITIES

During the last year, IAP has participation in many international events and has made contact with other international associations, summary of which is given below:

6.8.1 IAP's membership of CAA

IAP has decided to rejoin the Commonwealth Association of Architects (CAA). The president, IAP is in correspondence with the Executive Director of CAA, trying to work out the modalities of CAA fee payment which is based on the number of members of IAP.

6.8.2 ASA Convention, February 2011

IAP was represented at the Annual Convention of the Association of Siamese Architects (ASA) at Bangkok in February 2011, by Ar. Kalim Ahmed Siddiqui.

6.8.3 SLIA Convention, February 2011

President Shahab Ghani Khan represented IAP at the Annual Sessions and Convention of Sri Lanka Institute of Architects in February 2011.

6.8.4 SAARCH Meeting, Kathmandu, Nepal, April 2011

Vice President Ahmed Pervez Mirza was nominated by President Shahab Ghani Khan to represent IAP at the meeting of Presidents of South Asian Association for Regional Architects (SAARCH) held at Kathmandu in Feb 2011 and hosted by Society of Nepalese Architects in 2011. Ar. Mirza could not attend the meeting at the last minute due to unavoidable circumstances

6.8.5 Datum KL – PAM Convention, June 2011

President Shahab Ghani Khan and Ar. Kalim A Siddiqui attended the Annual Convention of PAM in June 2011 at Kuala Lumpur. Ar. Siddiqui, as Vice President of ARCASIA, also attended the ARCASIA Office Bearers' Meeting in KL.

6.8.6 32nd ARCASIA Council Meeting and Forum 16, Danang, Vietnam. August 2011

A large contingent of IAP members and some spouses attended the ARCASIA Forum 16 in Danang, Vietnam in August 2011. The official IAP delegates to the 32nd ARCASIA Council Meeting were President Ar. Shahab Ghani Khan and Ar. Syed Akeel Bilgrami, who was also the official delegate to the ARCASIA Committee for Architectural Education (ACAE). Vice President Ar. Suhail Abbasi and Ar. Fahim Ahsan Jamil represented IAP on the ARCASIA Committee for Professional Practice (ACPP) and Ar. Jahangir Khan Sherpao represented IAP on the ARCASIA Committee for Green & Sustainable Architecture (ACGSA). Ar. Shama Usman, Ar. Samar Ali Khan, Ar. Mujahid Sadiq. Ar. Najeeb Omar and Ar. Mian Mohammed Farooq were also part of IAP delegation along with Ar. Syed Zaigham Jaffery and Ar. Prof. Fariha Amjad Obaid, both of whom presented papers at the Forum. Ar. Kalim Siddiqui, as Vice President ARCASIA, attended the Council Meeting as Office Bearer.

6.8.7 International Union of Architects (UIA) World Congress of Architecture, Tokyo Sept 2011

This major world event that occurs once every three years was hosted by the Japan Institute of Architects (JIA) and attended by over 5000 architects and students from 90 countries. IAP was officially represented by President Ar. Shahab Ghani Khan, Ar. Syed Akeel Bilgrami and Ar. Kalim A. Siddiqui at the UIA World Assembly. Vice President Ar. Ahmed Pervez Mirza, Ar. Muhammad Arshad, Ar. Komal Pervez-Shahid and Ar. Madiha Ghani Khan also attended the Congress. At the Students' Jamboree and Design Workshop, simultaneously held in Tokyo, Ms. Qurat-ul-Ain Malik of IVS attended from Pakistan as a student delegate earlier nominated by IAP.

Ar. Syed Akeel Bilgrami made two presentations at two different forums at the Congress, namely, UIA Work Group on "Beyond Disasters, Through Solidarity, Towards Sustainability" and UIA Work Program "Architecture for All – Universal Accessibility".

2. IAP Karachi Chapter work for Flood Relief

Pakistan has been afflicted by a calamity of unprecedented magnitude. The floods in the River Indus and its tributaries have ravaged millions of acres of fertile land, uprooted over 20 million people, seriously affecting their livelihoods and their future. From the IAP platform members of the Karachi Chapter launched the IAP Flood Relief Fund and in the first fortnight, had collected over Rs 4.00 million for the flood victims in addition to arranging donations of over 40 tons of dry provisions and medicines. Camps were set up and sustained for about 100 families in Makli and the Chapter assisted the Pakistan Navy and some NGOs, both technically and financially in the reconstruction.

3. Presentation by Rocca, Tuesday January 11th 2011

Institute of Architects, Pakistan Karachi Chapter organized the presentation of the Country Manager Victor Schoone, Country Manager, Middle East, Roca at the Indus Valley School of Arts and Architecture Karachi Pakistan.

4. Lectures by Zarminae Ansari and Iftikhar Azam, were arranged on February 26, 2011 at NED City Campus, Karachi.
5. The exhibition, 21 Chairs, was held from April 5 to 11 at the Indus Valley School of Arts and Architecture Gallery to raise funds for the IAP House. Curated by Ar. Arshad Faruqi, The 21 chairs were designed and donated by members
6. The Karachi Chapter organized its sixth IAPEX on May 10-12, 2011 at the Karachi Expo Centre.
7. Lecture by Khadija Jamal was organized on June 04, 2011 at Dawood College of Engineering and Technology.

ACA-14 , 2010

This year, the Institute of Architects, Pakistan (IAP) was the proud host of the 14th Asian Congress of Architects (ACA-14) with the theme "Go Green: Architecture of the New Order" organized by its Lahore Chapter. Alongside ACA-14, the 31st ARCASIA Council Meeting and other related meetings and the ARCASIA Architectural Students' Jamboree were held in Lahore from 25-29 October 2010, attended by over 260 architects and faculty members and 550 architecture students from all over the country. More than 100 architects from 20 countries and 17 foreign students participated. Additionally more than 100 representatives of the building material industry also participated.

The program covered two-day ARCASIA Council Meeting, ARCASIA Committee for Architectural Education (ACAE) Meeting, Jury for ARCASIA Students' Competition and its exhibition, ARCASIA Committee for Green & Sustainable Architecture (ACGSA) and ARCASIA Committee for Professional Practice (ACPP) meetings.

The 14TH Asian Congress of Architects comprised of Technical sessions, Friendship Night, ARCASIA Awards Ceremony and a Farewell Dinner. The Congress was inaugurated by the Prime Minister of Pakistan at the Expo and Convention Centre, Lahore, the Governor Punjab hosted a dinner for all the delegates and students at the Governor House on "Friendship Night" and the Chief Minister of Punjab was Chief Guest at the concluding ceremony and distributed the ARCASIA Awards at the State Guest House.

ARCASIA Students' Jamboree was held at University of Engineering and Technology, Lahore, beginning on the 2nd day lasting for three full days with the theme of "Dynamism in Architecture: the Asian Spirit".

IAPEX Lahore 2011, with the theme, "**Architecture as an Expression of Poetic Spaces**" was organized as a 3-day Architects' Convention and Building Material and Product Exhibition from June 03 – 05, 2011 at Expo and Convention Centre, Lahore, inaugurated by the Chief Minister of Punjab. Around 300 Architects and students of Architecture from around the country, speakers from Bangladesh, Canada and Iran and around 100 exhibitors participated.

A special exhibition entitled "Islamabad: Birth of Capital" by Ar. Ibtesam Peerzada, was also on display. Students evening at National College of Arts and Technical Sessions on the theme "**Architecture as an expression of poetic spaces**", Seminar on "**Conservation of Shalimar Garden**" and a Closing and Awards distribution Ceremony, attended by the Governor Punjab, were also held.

7.3 PESHAWAR CHAPTER ACTIVITY REPORT 2010-2011

This year Peshawar Chapter achieved many milestones and was very active through the year. The Executive Committee set new goals to achieve in very difficult working environment. After the floods, the Chapter actively participated in relief efforts.

There were 12 Executive Committee Meetings held during the year.

For the first time in the history of IAP, Peshawar Chapter hosted the National Council meeting at Village Restaurant, which was very successful. At the Meeting the Chapter took the initiative to introduce Plastic Cards for IAP Life time paid up members, which is under process.

In spite of this busy schedule, unfavourable tragic conditions (severe casualties in bomb blasts) the Chapter is committed to hold IAPEX 2011 in September-October 2011.

This year Peshawar Chapter's Architecture / Portfolio Series was more frequent and highlighted the work of Pakistani Architects and Architectural Firms. The program was a great success and a large number of architects and architecture students attended its many sessions.

Following architects presented their work/ projects in the different sessions: Ar. Yasmin Lari, Ar. Muhammad Faisal Rehman and Ar. Muhammad Khalid.

Peshawar Chapter has set new milestones to achieve by founding "OUR PESHAWAR COUNCIL" under which the Chapter has gathered Religious, Governmental and different social welfare organizations to work for the welfare of Peshawar and for restoration of the OLD CITY OF FLOWERS.

This year Peshawar Chapter worked on beautification of Peshawar and launched a pilot project of "Clean & Green Peshawar" with the partnership of PYO (Peshawar Youth Organization), UWT (Usmania Welfare Trust), STC (Sarhad Tourism Corporation) & Tajir Biradre of Peshawar which was very successful. In this campaign 2000 students from different Colleges & Universities were mobilized to clean up the city.

IAP-PC is also actively involved with other organizations like SCN (Sarhad Conservation Network) DLG (De Las Gul) etc in court petitions against tree cutting on GT Road without an EIA.

7.4 RAWALPINDI ISLAMABAD CHAPTER ACTIVITY REPORT 2010-11

It was an eventful year for Rawalpindi Islamabad Chapter of IAP. The Executive committee 2010-11 has been very active since the first day with an intent to give back to the profession and raise the profile of IAP Member Architects as well as integrate and synergise the new local architectural schools student community.

The Rawalpindi-Islamabad Chapter Lecture Series continued to highlight the work of Architects and Architectural Firms. Lecture series events were attended by large number of architects and architecture students and their active participation proved these lectures a great success. The Chapter was able to bring both international and local Architects on the platform of IAP-RIC which has been effective in improving interaction between architects, students and sponsors who are always enthusiastic to collaborate with the Institute to bring events that gives the opportunity to learn from the experiences of other practicing architects.

The Chapter Executive Committee felt the need to contribute to our community in the wake of recent floods. IAP initiated IAP Post Flood Housing Design Students Competition inviting the students of the three local PCATP Accredited schools of Architecture (COMSATS Isb, NCA Rwp & UET Abbottabad). There was an overwhelming response in submissions and the design exhibition was held in School of Architecture & Design, NUST Islamabad. The competition was judged by a jury of most respectable senior practicing architects . The exhibition was attended by a large number of students from UET Abbottabad, NCA Rawalpindi, COMSATS Islamabad along with respected faculty members and architects.

Cash awards of Rs. 50,000/- , 30,000/- and 20,000/- respectively were given to winning teams entries and certificates to participants and volunteers at the awards ceremony, which was attended by a large number of students along with respected faculty and Architects.

In order to promote architectural education, IAP-RIC had announced a scholarship to two deserving students of graduating class each from all three accredited schools in the region. An evening was planned to award the numerations to the students as nominated by their departments. The Scholarship sponsor was also recognized in this event.

IAP RIC had collected a reasonable amount of donation from its generous members for the flood victims. In considering the cold weather we prepared 250 warm bedding packages and distributed to deserving families in Charsadda which has been one of the badly affected area during last year's floods. Each bedding package consisted of a full set of Blanket, bedding and a pillow with cover.

Islamabad Architecture celebrated its 50 years in full swing as the Rawalpindi-Islamabad Chapter of organized this year's first IAPEX in the twin cities from April 22-24, 2011 at PC Rawalpindi. It comprised of the Building Products Exhibition inaugurated by Mr. Gauhar Ayub Khan, former Foreign Minister, with a very big participation from the public.

An exhibition of recent Architectural Graduates was sponsored by 6 local architectural firms. Three of the leading vendors participated in the Building Product Seminar to educate both students and architects about their products.

A Forum on 50 Years of Islamabad Architecture was inaugurated by the Chairman CDA and papers were read by Ar. Samra Khan, Ahmad Zaib Masud from Belgium and Dr. Bajwa from Lahore.

The second Forum was on Post Floods & Earthquakes: Humanitarian Disaster Mitigation. Excellent papers were read by Dr. Carmen Advisor to UN representative for Disaster management in Pakistan, Ar. Sikandar Ajam Khan and Ar. Akeel Bilgrami from Karachi.

The last Forum on IAP- Board of Architectural Education, a roundtable of all architectural schools under the aegis of IAP, was presented to teachers and students of local architectural schools by Architect Akeel Bilgrami in his presentation. Four local schools presented their programmes to the audience highlighting their schools teaching paradigm.

The events included a Pictorial Exhibition - 50 Years Of Islamabad Architecture, curated by architect Ibtesam Pirzada, Cultural Performances by Students Of Architecture, Architectural Quiz for students and Architects Recognition Awards Dinner Gala at which 50 Architects involved with IAP were recognized from all over Pakistan. The Jazz Dinner gala was the culmination of IAPEX 2011

Chairman IAP – RIC hosted a fine dinner at Signature Restaurant in honor of all Architectural schools in Rawalpindi Islamabad, COMSATS, NCA, and NUST and gave awards to recognize the architects behind all three Prof. Pervez Vandal of COMSATS, Ar. Sikandar Ajam Khan of NUST and Prof Sajida Vandal of NCA Rawalpindi.
