



IAP FELLOWSHIP ELIGIBILITY AND SELECTION CRITERIA

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA:

IAP Constitution Clause 05 FELLOWS:

No person shall be eligible to become a Fellow of the Institute unless they have at least twenty years of post-qualification professional experience and have been an Associate of the Institute in good standing for a minimum period of fifteen years with demonstrated service to the objectives of the Institute and are outstanding as a professional in practice, service, or education. The National Council may invite such a member to become a Fellow upon receiving a proposal in writing from a Fellow of the Institute.

In the above there are four essential pre-requisites for the Eligibility.

- At least 20 years' post qualification professional experience.
- Associate of the Institute in good standing for a minimum period of fifteen years.
- Demonstrated service to the objectives of the Institute.
- Achievements as a professional architect, in practice, or in service or in education.

The written proposal from a Fellow must contain at least a paragraph each on the four aspects to clearly demonstrate how the nominee Associate fulfills the criteria.

The proposal should be addressed to the President and two Vice Presidents of IAP, who will then present it as an agenda item, including the nominee's name, at the subsequent meeting of the National Council, during which the proposals will be considered.

SELECTION CRITERIA: MAJORITY OF VOTES

IAP Constitution Clause 49. Meetings of the National Council:

The National Council may meet together for the dispatch of business, adjourn, and otherwise regulate their meetings and proceedings as they think fit, provided that at least one meeting is held every quarter and at least 14 days prior notice of such meeting is sent to all the members and office-bearers of the National Council. Questions arising at any meeting of the National Council shall be decided by a majority of votes. In case of an equality of votes, the Chairman shall have a second or casting vote. The Honorary Secretary, on the requisition of at least three members/office-bearers of the National Council, shall convene a meeting of the National Council within fourteen days, giving prior notice of at least seven days.
