IAP-RIC and RDA Join Hands to Transform Rawalpindi's Urban Landscape

A landmark meeting between the Institute of Architects Pakistan – Rawalpindi-Islamabad Chapter (IAP-RIC) and the Rawalpindi Development Authority (RDA) has set the stage for a collaborative effort to reimagine Rawalpindi's urban development. Held at the RDA office, the meeting explored avenues to integrate architectural excellence and innovative urban planning into the city's development strategies.

The IAP-RIC delegation was led by Chairman Ar. Abdullah Khan, accompanied by Vice Chairperson Ar. Nimra Qazi, Hon. Secretary Ar. Sannah Ejaz, Hon. Treasurer Ar. Ukkasha Numan Ehsan, and EC Members Ar. Uzma Kabir Ar. Rweeda Himayat and Ar. Syed Qasim Abbas.

Representing the RDA, Assistant Director (Architecture) Ar. Rida Sultan welcomed the delegation and underscored the importance of fostering a strategic partnership.

Key Discussions and Outcomes:

Enhancing Architect Representation in RDA:

The discussion emphasized the critical need for greater inclusion of architects within RDA to address pressing urban design and planning challenges.

IAP-RIC reaffirmed its commitment to advocating for architects' roles in shaping Rawalpindi's future.

Proposal for an Architectural Wing:

A groundbreaking proposal to establish an Architectural Wing within RDA was discussed, aiming to institutionalize architectural expertise and ensure architects play a central role in urban projects. The model implemented by the Capital Development Authority (CDA) was cited as a successful precedent.

Fostering Innovation through Academia:

Both parties recognized the value of engaging academic institutions to introduce research-driven, innovative solutions for urban development projects in Rawalpindi.

Developing a Strategic Collaboration Roadmap:

IAP-RIC recommended that RDA outline a clear strategic vision to define the scope of the collaboration effectively.

This roadmap would guide joint initiatives and ensure alignment with long-term development goals.

Invitation to IAPEX 2025:

IAP-RIC formally invited RDA representatives, including the Director General, to participate in a dedicated session at IAPEX 2025. This flagship event, themed "Urban Horizons – Architecture and the Future of Urban Precincts," will provide a platform to formalize partnerships and launch joint initiatives.

Building a Shared Vision for Urban Excellence:

The meeting concluded with both IAP-RIC and RDA expressing mutual enthusiasm and a shared commitment to leveraging architectural innovation to address the city's urban challenges. This collaboration marks a significant step in promoting sustainable development, enhancing the quality of urban spaces, and positioning architects as key contributors to Rawalpindi's transformation.


